## *Contracting Corner*

### **Medical Contracting Workshops**

Contracted professional services are becoming more common in the Air Force Medical Service. Customer feedback from the Air Force Medical Service Senior Leadership Conference and the Managed Care Symposium indicated customers wanted contract administration training tailored to the users' needs at the Medical Treatment Facility (MTF). Contracting workshops are an effective way to deliver the training.

The workshop reviews topics in contracting relevant to the needs of logistics personnel at the MTF. Topics to be discussed at the workshop include: working with the contracting office; applicable regulations and their impact on the contracting process; when to contract for services; types of contracts, including personal and non-personal services contracts, and when each type is appropriate. Contents of each section of a contract, performance work statements, quality assurance surveillance plans, contract surveillance, how to make changes to an existing contract, and how to enforce the terms of a contract will also be discussed.

The CONUS workshop is scheduled for 8-9 February 2000 at Lackland AFB TX in the Medical Equipment Maintenance Facility, Building 3450 (adjacent to Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center). Seating is limited to 40.

### **Processing Credit Return Orders with the Prime Vendor**

Many credit return companies process credits back to the account through the prime vendor. It's important that these credits are used within 90 days. At the same time, it's important that medical

logistics abides by the policy written in AFMAN 23-110, Volume 5.

It's also important that credits are applied where earned, meaning WRM credits should be used to obtain replacement WRM assets and peacetime credits should be used to obtain replacement peacetime assets.

Our goal is to drive a behavior within logistics and with our customers to ensure the effective use of the credits earned. The customers, like medical logistics, are stewards for the resources they use, in this case money. Using activities must be aware of the consequences of spending scarce money for excess stock. This results in waste through items expiring, not being used, etc. AF policy is that customer credit is provided for turn-ins if there is an anticipated future use for the item. It also disallows customer credit if items are suspended or outdated. Policy also states that credit can be given if logistics knows a credit is forthcoming. That credit should be applied at the time the turn-in is processed.

Create a master record with a local purchase routing identifier (RID) specifically for using credits. Use the "EVD" transaction to load the credit account and prime vendor information so there is a document for warehouse personnel to receive the order(s). Once the amounts of the credits are known and what they are going to be used for has been determined, contact the prime vendor and work out the best way to place a credit account order (they should have the credits in a separate account). Most prime vendors want a faxed order from the credit account. Do not use the prime vendor interface, as there are too many things that can and will go wrong, or place an order using the RID "PV\*!"

Process the ESD(s) with a refund code of "N". Don't put an RC/CC in the ESD unless the user turned in the items that created the credit in the prime vendor account. If you can't verify this, issue the items as reimbursable. This ensures the account can support an audit on credit returns/orders. Just because medical logistics receives items without charge doesn't mean it can be issued free of charge to the customers. (AFMLO/FOC-A, Dale Lyons, DSN 343-4017, dale.lyons@ft-detrick.af.mil)

from the site. Additionally, this file will load the critical item code. Specific instructions for loading the file are contained on the AFMLO web site at Medical Combat Support Operations ([www.medicine.army.mil/afmlo/foc-o](http://www.medicine.army.mil/afmlo/foc-o)). You should review these prior to downloading the file.

The download option is at the bottom of each AS detail information screen. To access:

- Use the Allowance Standards Query to select a specific AS. This can be accomplished through different search options - AS #, UTC, or WRM Project Code.
- Once selected, scroll to the bottom of the AS detail to the “Create SLR/LVQ” button. Once you have entered the requested information, i.e., your SRAN (numbers only), and the required Detachment (DET) and WRM Project Code (PRJ) (upper or lower case), select the “Create SLR/LVQ” button.

In addition, you must also download the Placeholder NSN Report Source of Supply Information file at the same time to provide that required information.

### Shipping Sterilant Overseas

Several overseas locations have reported problems getting STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate shipped to

them. According to US Department Of Transportation (DOT) regulations, STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate is classified as a hazardous material when transported in commerce. As such, when shipments arrive at the Tracy or Mechanicsburg depot they overpack it, and then offer it up for shipment by air or sea. The majority of the time it goes by sea. Normally this would not be a problem, but STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate has a short shelf life of six months or less. It takes the seavan shipment two – three months and many times the STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate arrives expired or very near the expiration date.

Currently, in-country sources for STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate are limited to Korea and the U.K. Therefore, if STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate is not available in-country, it must be shipped from the states. Because of its short shelf life, it must be shipped by air. Organic peroxides such as STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate are normally forbidden from air transport, but STERIS Corp. has an exemption from the US DOT to airship STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate by cargo aircraft only. Air shipments of STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate may only be conducted in accordance with the exemption and a copy of the exemption must accompany all air shipments. We confirmed with STERIS Corp. and the military depots that the current packaging by STERIS Corp. meets the International Air Transport Association (IATA) regulations for hazardous materiel and no additional packaging is required. STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate is packaged in a United Nations POP Container that is suitable for shipment by air.

We have coordinated with STERIS Corp., Dover and Travis AFB, and several ordering activities to set up recommended procedures to help alleviate shipping problems. If you already have a system that works, please disregard our guidance. For medical facilities in Korea, Technoland maintains an inventory of STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate. The POC in Korea is Mr. Gerald Lee, phone number 82-2-515-1256 or fax 82-2-515-6211. Medical facilities in Korea should try to obtain STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate from this supplier. Medical facilities in Europe should contact the STERIS U.K. sales office. The POC is Ms. Melanie Warren, phone number 011-44-1608-811822 or fax 011-44-1608-811854. You may be

able to place an order directly with that office or you can work with the sales representative for that country/region to find out if there is a dealer in-country who is contracted to sell STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate. Orders may be faxed to Laurie Vosicky at STERIS Corp., fax 440-639-4459 or [laura\\_vosicky@steris.com](mailto:laura_vosicky@steris.com).

Those medical activities not ordering STERIS 20 Sterilant Concentrate in-country should request shipment by military air. Shipments to the PACAF area should be sent directly to Travis AFB, and shipments to the USAFE area directly to Dover AFB. Please ensure all shipments have a DD Form 1387, Military Shipping Label in plain view on the outside of the box. The Required Delivery Date (Block 11 on this form) must be marked as “999” and the Transportation Priority (Block 6) as 1. Shipments must be accompanied with a completed “Shippers Declaration for Danger Goods” form. Also, remember to provide STERIS Corp. with a Transportation Control Number. We recommend you set up a standard drop shipments with STERIS Corp. where they automatically ship every couple months to your facility.
