Air Force Computer Systems Manual AFCSM 41-230

The final version of AFCSM 41-230, Volume 2, dated 1 June 1998 is now available. This manual replaces the draft version (1 November 1997), released with the implementation package and the interim change (1 March 1998) that was part of the H98110 software release.

This MIM addresses the processing and transfer of the end of month (EOM) SMI for inventory analysis (S08). The data collected from this SMI will be transferred automatically via MEDTRANS to a server at HQ AFMSA.

Defense Medical Logistics Standard System (DMLSS) Updates

FCS Patch .04 – What Does It Mean?

DMLSS Release 1.0, Patch .04 was fielded worldwide in May 1998 and provides Forward Customer Support (FCS) users with new functionality and expanded access to catalog data for pharmaceutical and med-surg products.

Prime Vendor (PV) Order Numbers

FCS includes PV order numbers for products available from your MED/SURG PV under Distribution and Pricing Agreements (DAPAs). The MED/SURG PV order number is a unique vendor item number that identifies a specific manufacturer and catalog number available under a single DAPA. *Note:* A single item may be available under multiple DAPAs with different manufacturers or distributors and have multiple PV order numbers assigned.

With the inclusion of PV order numbers in FCS, users have a single place to look up items available from their PV and items stocked locally by the MTF. FCS also provides users the ability to order items through the MTF legacy system. Previously, PV order numbers were available to users through the Product and Price Comparison (PPC) tool (discontinued last fall), or the Universal Data Repository (UDR) CD-ROM. Sites could also access the PV order number information using their PV's order entry system.

FCS users can search for a specific MED/SURG PV order number by entering it as the search criteria in the Catalog Number field of the Search for Medical Products screen. The PV order number will be displayed on the Summary Search Results screen. Users may have to scroll to the right or select the Change View button to view the PV order number. The user may also designate a specific default column order for the PV order number to appear on the Summary Search Results screen by using the Options button Column Order tab on the Search Medical Products screen.

With the combination of the PV order number search in the Catalog Number field, users may get some unexpected results when executing a search. When searching by catalog or part number (particularly when using a wildcard search), the Search Summary Results screen may return items not matching the catalog or part number entered. The PV order number for items returned may match the catalog or part number searched, explaining why items were in the search results.

The PV order number will not appear on the New Item Request (NIR) or Request for Materials generated by FCS. This is identified as a future enhancement. Users need to print the Search Results using a screen print; or write down the PV order number on the order request form if the PV order number is required. PV order numbers for pharmaceutical products are not available in any of the DMLSS catalog tools. The National Drug Code (NDC) should be used when ordering pharmaceutical PV items with an SOS of PVP. Regional Distribution and Pricing Agreements (R-DAPAs)

R-DAPAs are Distribution and Pricing Agreements limited in scope and applicable to specific PV regions. The Regional DAPA may be for products stocked by the PV and available to customers in sizes differing from packaging on the national DAPA (i.e., PG or EA vs. CS). R-DAPAs may also include product lines only available within specific geographic areas supported by the PV or distributor.

If a regional DAPA item is available in your PV region, the item will appear on your FCS Summary Search Results screen like other DAPA items with an SOS of PVM or PVP. Only if the Results option is set to "Show All Items" and the regional DAPA item is not applicable to your region will the user see a difference. In this case, the item on the Summary Search Results screen will appear with an SOS of RVM or RVP to designate a Regional DAPA item not available in the current PV region. Items with an SOS of RVM or RVP cannot be ordered from your PV.

Owen Healthcare Classification Data Implementation

With the deployment of Patch .04, the IMS America product classification data, upon which the FCS Categorical Search was based, was replaced by the Owen Healthcare Classification data. This provides users with current product classification data to perform categorical searches for medical/surgical products in FCS. This change also required the temporary disabling of the "Similar" item button functionality in FCS until Owen Healthcare can support a comparable item capability.

New DMLSS Installation Wizard

Following the fielding of DMLSS Release 1.01, Patch .04 in early May 1998, a new DMLSS Installation Wizard was deployed to all DMLSS 1.01 activities. The DMLSS Installation Wizard simplifies the process of installing DMLSS client software such as Patch .04. Before the DMLSS Installation Wizard, software was installed as a series of independent programs. The DMLSS Installation Wizard combines the installation of multiple client software components into a single process and minimizes manual intervention.

The DMLSS Installation Wizard provides the flexibility to select various installation options, to include an FCS, FM, or DMLSS client (including all DMLSS client software), or a customized installation including any combination of DMLSS components. This product is used in the installation of new DMLSS clients or as a tool to correct problems with existing DMLSS clients. UDR Network Installation Problem

A problem has been identified with the June 1998 UDR CD-ROM product when accessing a CD drive across a Windows NT Network. When installing the UDR CD-ROM from a Windows NT networked CD drive to a client PC using either Windows 3.11 or Windows 95, the user gets an error message – "Severe Error – Unable to open Version Data File". This problem is corrected in the July 1998 release of the UDR CD-ROM. Users are advised to run the UDR CD-ROM from a local CD drive.

Distribution and Pricing Agreement (DAPA) Change Notifications

The Pymah Corporation Med/Surg DAPA has been canceled. Pymah no longer exists, and is an operating component of 3M. Of the 116 items on the Pymah DAPA, those not discontinued will be added to 3M DAPA, SP0200-94-H-5058.

A determination of discontinued items and those migrating to 3M has not been completed. If customers have concerns regarding specific Pymah items, contact DSCP. If items are being discontinued, it is probably because of a similar 3M product and DSCP will assist in finding an equivalent.

DAPA, DLA120-93-H-5228 is cancelled.

With the exception of items no longer in production, the Beiersdorf-Jobst products have transferred to the American Medical Depot DAPA, SP0200-98-H-0068.

Xomed DAPA has been deleted from the DAPA database effective 1 August 1998 based on dissemination of UDR and DAPA. Customers should not hold their PV accountable for non-supply of product. Xomed customer service representatives were instructed to reject DAPA orders as of 1 June. This is outside the control of PVs.

Most Xomed items have already transitioned to the Two Rivers DAPA, SP0200-97-H-5049. We expect all items to be added to Two Rivers shortly.

Attachment 4 is additional DAPA changes and deletions. This information contains detail data for DAPA changes and deletions. The reporting of changes/deletions is dependent upon matching the DAPA item with sales data submitted by the PV. Not all accounts have sales reported to DSCP yet. Current Status of Decentralized Blanket Purchase Agreements (DBPAs)

Pages 1 through 95 of **Attachment 3** are a list of pen and ink changes to the consolidated list provided in Attachment 3 of AFMLL 04-98.

DBPA Purchases Over \$2500

For purchases under \$2,500, you can buy from almost any source without competition. Just ensure the price is fair and reasonable and that you rotate sources among qualified suppliers. Small business set asides do not apply at this threshold, therefore, you can buy from small or large business. Since the International Merchant Purchase Authorization Card (IMPAC) is the preferred method for purchases under \$2500, use the IMPAC card vs. the DBPA whenever possible. Rules change once you exceed the \$2,500 limit.

Purchases against DBPAs over \$2,500 are subject to competition requirements. To promote competition to the maximum, solicit quotes from a reasonable number of sources (preferably three, but two is sufficient if documented as the only sources available).

For open market items, all supplies or services having an anticipated dollar value between \$2,500 and \$100,000 are reserved for small businesses, unless there is no reasonable expectation of obtaining quotes from two or more responsible small businesses. "For proposed contracts actions expected to exceed \$25,000, you must synopsise in the CBD. For greater than \$10,000, but less than \$25,000 you are required to display in a public place, including on an electronic bulletin board, or any other appropriate electronic means located at the contracting office (MTF) issuing the solicitation, an unclassified notice of the solicitation or a copy of the solicitation satisfying the requirements of FAR5.207 (c) & (f)."

Purchases made against Federal Supply Schedules (FSS) are exempt from small business set-asides, but need to be competed. Multiple FSS schedules for requirements that exceed \$2,500 need to be competed. Optional FSS should be used if they meet your requirements before purchasing on the open market. Before placing a call against an FSS for over \$2,500, consider what is in the best interest of the government in terms of quality, responsiveness, or cost. Orders should be placed with the schedule contractor providing the supply or service representing the best value.

Competition may consist of comparing and recording prices for like items on different DBPAs. If price lists are not available, quotes should be solicited and price lists, etc. be obtained for review/verification. Limit solicitation to one source if only one source is available. Justification for noncompetitive acquisitions over \$2,500 must be included in the DBPA file. Record verbal quotes on AF Form 3062.

Report all actions on local, DSCP and VANAC DBPAs to the Base Contracting Officer (BCO) monthly. Highlight calls on your register exceeding \$25,000 must have a DD Form 350 completed. For all calls expected to exceed \$25,000, FAR 5.101 & 5.203 states that you must advertise in the Commerce Business Daily.

For additional information on competition requirements, review the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Part 13.106, Soliciting Competition, Evaluation of Quotations or Offers, Award and Documentation; and FAR Part 8.4, Federal Supply Schedules. For more information on

the DD Form 350, see DFARs Subpart 204.6-Contract Reporting or contact your BCO.
