HAMS Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (I.D.I.Q.) Contracts

Navy FISC awarded the first ever, multiple award Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contracts for hospital asepsis. Three contractors, Stroh, National, and Rite-Way were selected to compete for task orders for seventeen facilities. Task orders are due to be awarded on 15 Aug with services starting 1 Oct 99.

This contract award is different than individual HAMS contracts awarded in the past and is significant for several reasons:

- ◆ Any DoD CONUS hospital or clinic can be added via task order
- ◆ The number of modifications will be greatly reduced. This will save time at both the MTF, AFMSA and contracting
- ◆ Clinics and other medical treatment facilities (MTFs) can be a part of the HAMS program and are strongly encouraged to call Mr. Jimmie Connell or myself if interested

- ◆ Task orders can be added in 2-4 months, which is much better than a full procurement cycle which, if protested, can take 9 to 18 months

Shelf Life Program Testing Update

Mefloquine HCL Tablets ***NSN 6505-01-315-1275***

Reference DOD/MMQC Message 99-5062. The FDA has decided to discontinue testing Mefloquine HCL Tablets in the Shelf Life Program. During the past three years, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has tested 21 lots of Mefloquine HCL Tablets. The original expiration dates for all Mefloquine tablet lots tested fall in the range from 1996 to 1998. Of all the "original" lots FDA received and stress tested during 1997 and 1998, only 35.3% passed testing and were extended. Only 50% of the surviving "original" lots passed the retest the following year for a total pass ratio of about 17%. As a result, testing of Mefloquine tablets is not cost effective. All Mefloquine lots previously extended will be eliminated from further consideration in the Shelf Life Program. Additionally the FDA has reduced the previous extension for remaining lots of Mefloquine. (AFMLO/FOM-P, Mrs. Bonnie Phillips FOM-P, DSN 343-4170)

Upcoming Multiple Pharmaceutical Prime Vendor (PV) Re-Awards

Over the next six months there will be multiple pharmaceutical prime vendor (PV) re-awards. The re-awards are both normal scheduled re-awards and re-awards based on **realignment to TRICARE Regions**. By the end of June all California and Washington State bases will have a new PV contract in place. The nine bases affected by the re-award are Fairchild, McChord, Beale, McClellan, Travis, Edwards, Los Angeles, Vandenburg and Onizuka. By the end of December 99 all bases in Texas, Oklahoma, Colorado, Montana, Idaho, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, North/South Dakota, Wyoming, Louisiana, Arkansas, Utah, and Missouri will have a new PV contract in place. The 32 affected bases are AFMLO/Fort Worth, Altus,

Barksdale, Brooks, Dyess, Goodfellow, Laughlin, Little Rock, Randolph, Sheppard, Tinker, Vance, Wilford Hall, Cannon, Davis-Monthan, Ellsworth, FE Warren, Grand Forks, Hill, Holloman, Kirtland, Luke, Malmstrom, McConnell, Minot, Mountain Home, Nellis, Offutt, Peterson, Air Force Academy, and Whiteman. Once the new contracts are awarded there is a sixty-day start up period to phase in the new contractor. The new contracts have a 20-month performance period with two options. Another new feature in the contracts is the addition of a secondary back-up prime vendor. The secondary PV will act as another source in the event the primary cannot meet your requirement. The secondary PV has a higher surcharge and it's own ordering system. Please use the chart below as a PV conversion checklist. Any questions can be directed to Capt Troy Molnar at DSN 343-4083.

30 days prior	Review translation table for accuracy. If possible have NDCs for all products vice PV item number. This will help with a smooth conversion by DMLSS
30 days prior	If buying off a regional DAPA vice the national DAPA check with new PV to see if they have the product on their DAPA. If the new PV does not have the item request it be added to their regional DAPA.
30 days prior	Make sure all PV master records have the MILSTRIP format (i.e. package: right PG wrong PK) for unit of issue instead of the current PVs unit of issue format
30 days prior	Start planning the completion of EDOs and drop shipments prior to start date of the new contract
NLT 30 days prior	Establish contact with new PV customer service representative
NLT 30 days prior	Establish contact with DSCP Case Manager
7-15 days prior	Training on new PV order entry system and software
Last day	Process all P N D receipts for previous PV materiel already received---don't forget drop shipment and EDO orders
