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MEDICAL MATERIEL

Radiation Safety and Chemical Agent Monitors

Have you ever had questions about Chemical Agent Monitors (CAMS)? Based on some recent input from the field, we think there are many questions regarding War Reserve Materiel (WRM) CAMS.

The CAM is a handheld, battery-operated device used to detect nerve or blister chemical warfare agents. Each CAM contains a small amount (10 millicuries) of Nickel-63, a Beta-emitting low-level radioactive material. This material is located in a sealed cell in the body of the CAM that is inaccessible without disassembling the instrument.

Like all equipment items with radioactive sources, the CAM is regulated by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). To legally possess a CAM, the owning organization (in our case the Medical Group) must have a valid Radioactive Materials (RAM) permit. For the Air Force, the NRC has delegated the authority to issue permits to the USAF Radioisotope Committee (HQ AFMOA/SGOR Bolling AFB DC). This RAM permit identifies, among other things, the number of CAMS allowed, conditions for storage, testing required, and permit expiration date.

For medical WRM, the most common base-level packages requiring CAMS are Patient Decon (UTC FFGLA - Project Code IA) and BNBC (UTC FFGL1 – Project Code IE). Current allowance standards requires six CAMS for a Patient Decon equipment package, and four for a BNBC package. After you have determined you need CAMS for your equipment package or packages, the Medical Group (MDG) must obtain a RAM permit. A letter of request to HQ AFMOA/SGOR will start the

process. See AFI 40-201, "Managing Radioactive Materials in the USAF," for additional information on RAM Permits. At this time, a permit Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) must be established in writing by the MDG Commander. Most commonly, this permit RSO will be a Bioenvironmental Engineering Officer or NCO, since specialized training is required for this job per AFI 40-201. Bioenvironmental Engineering also serves as the Base RSO, and is an excellent source of information on RAM permit requirements. After a signed RAM permit is received from HQ AFMOA/SGOR, CAMS can now be ordered for your unit. They will typically be shipped from Kelly AFB, Texas, and may take 4-6 weeks for delivery.

Upon receipt of the CAMS, notify the permit RSO as soon as possible, and save all shipping documentation. The CAMS must be surveyed and stored in an area approved by the permit RSO. A clearly marked, lockable storage cabinet or room is typically required. According to NRC regulations, an NRC Form 3 informational poster must be placed near the storage location for everyone in the work area to see. AFI 40-201 adds some supplemental wording to this informational poster. The permit RSO and the Medical Logistics staff are responsible for meeting the conditions in the RAM permit for the safe storage, inventory, and swipe testing of the CAMS units. Ultimately, the owner of the permit, the MDG Commander, is accountable for the conditions of the RAM permit, so a team effort is required.

Attention must be paid to both radiation safety and accessibility of CAMS for deployment and training scenarios. For example, storing CAMS on a cabinet shelf properly labeled by project code, in individual DOT-approved shipping boxes, will greatly simplify any pallet marshalling tasks. With some well-developed local procedures, gaining access for radiation safety surveys and training, and packaging CAMS units for deployments, will be quite simple.

If a CAM is lost or damaged, notify the permit RSO and the base RSO (they may be the same person) as soon as possible! This is to control any hazard that may develop, and to meet strict Radioisotope

Committee reporting requirements involving damage or loss of a permitted radioactive source.

Fortunately, unless significant damage is done to the main body of the CAM, it's highly unlikely any hazard could develop. Two excellent sources of information about how to manage your CAMS safely and legally are the RAM permit itself and AFI 40-201. Gaining familiarity with these documents, and working closely with the permit RSO, will ensure all requirements are met, and your CAMS are ready when you need them! Cancellation of Centrally Managed Equipment Due-Ins

AFMLO/FOC-O is currently in the process of correcting and adjusting our Centrally Managed Equipment (CME), functional identifier code "C" requisition records. This is the program formerly known as Centrally Procured Equipment. AFMLO is now responsible for funding the majority of CME and must clear up numerous erroneous Due-Ins previously established so that accurate requirements can be determined. The process of correcting and adjusting our records will cause the cancellation of numerous SRA Due-In records currently loaded in MEDLOG.

Upon notification via e-mail or telephone, we request that each SRA process KRD transactions to cancel the identified requisitions. Completion of these actions will ensure that your MEDLOG data is accurate and facilitate the identification of accurate CME requirements. Commanders responsible for SORTS reporting should be briefed on the due-in status change, to include recommendations for changes in any corresponding SORTS narrative comments.
