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MEDICAL MATERIEL

Medical Catalog (MEDCAT) / Medical Catalog Enhanced (MEDCAT-X) On CD-ROM

Air Force subscribers to the MEDCAT CD-ROM must transition to the MEDCAT-X CD-ROM no later than 30 October 1996. All subscriptions to MEDCAT will be changed to MEDCAT-X effective with the November 1996 issue. Any activity that does not have the required computer hardware (IBM compatible 386 or better) to support MEDCAT-X should notify AFMLO/FOC-T immediately. MEDCAT-X offers extensive search options as well as drawings and commercial databases, Prime Vendor (PV) indicators, the D-Day Significant Item List, and Air Force Tables of Allowance.

A new product, the Universal Data Repository (UDR), will also be introduced with the November 1996 and December 1996 issues of MEDCAT-X. A brief description of the UDR, which will replace MEDCAT-X in January 1997, is at **Attachment 6**.

The UDR offers expanded search capability, DBPA and Quality Assurance Data and all features in the current MEDCAT-X. Future enhancements to the UDR will further expand

Scope Shield II Radio System Notes

Technical Orders (TOs)

Air Force Medical Logistics Consultant Program

The Air Force Medical Logistics Consultant Program was developed to provide specialized assistance to bases with a specific problem area. (See AFMLL 9-95, page MM-2, for the original announcement letter.) All facets of medical logistics will be covered by the program. Bases requiring assistance may be identified by anyone; however, use of the consultant services will not be directed unless coordinated with the appropriate major command (MAJCOM) counterpart. When a consultant is required, one will be selected which represents the needs of the base and is closest in geographical proximity, if an in-place visit is required. Use of a consultant will be coordinated between HQ AFMSA, AFMLO, the MAJCOM, and the requesting activity and supporting base. Necessary funding to support the consultant's visit will be determined on a case-by-case basis. This program is not intended to replace or augment staff assistance visits or manning assistance. If your

base has a specific problem area and requires the services of a consultant, contact your MAJCOM for assistance.

Telephone consultation service is also encouraged. The logistics personnel identified on **Attachment 1** of this AFMLL are appointed as consultants for their respective areas. Bases may contact these individuals directly when telephone consultations will meet required needs.

Deoxyribo Nucleic Acid (DNA) Testing

By direction of the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs) and the Air Force Surgeon General, all active duty and Reserve servicemen will have DNA specimens collected no later than 31 Dec 99. All aircrew members (rated, not-rated, active, and inactive) must be tested by 31 Dec 96. No service member may deploy without having DNA specimen on file. Reserve medical squadrons are authorized to collect DNA specimens from all military members as part of their annual physical examinations to meet the testing deadline of 31 Dec 99. 2. DRUG/SUPPLY PRODUCT RECALLS AND MEDICAL INFORMATION. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) advises that the drug products listed below were recalled by the manufacturers or distributors concerned. The FDA has classified these recalls as follows:

CLASS I: A situation in which there is a reasonable probability that the use of, or exposure to, a violative product will cause serious, adverse health consequences or death.

CLASS II: A situation in which the use of, or exposure to, a violative product may cause temporary or medically reversible adverse health consequences or where the probability of serious adverse health consequences is remote.

CLASS III: A situation in which the use of, or exposure to, a violative product is not likely to cause adverse health consequences. Most of these items are nonstandard, and the possibility exists that medical activities may have purchased them locally. There is also a possibility that some of these items have NSNs assigned and may have been reported in earlier Q.A. messages.
